GENERAL DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

The Central Administration of Statistics (CAS) is pleased and delighted to present to all the stakeholders in socioeconomic, environmental, and research fields the Statistical Yearbook 2008.

As CAS believes in dynamic improvement and quality work, the Statistical Yearbook 2008 is unique especially that it covers new sectors and variables and expands old ones.

In fact, this Yearbook studies Lebanon administrative division and presents the mission and vision of CAS.

The environment sector is better studied through the knowledge provided by MEDSTAT II Environment Program and by the UN ESCWA. Therefore, it studies morphology, geology, climatology, hydrology, and vegetation. It also sketches a holistic vision of the water sector in Lebanon for the first time.

This yearbook studies also agriculture through the traditional variables provided by the Ministry of Agriculture and by the Green Project. It also includes the results of the agricultural census conducted by the Ministry of Agriculture between 1997 and 2005.

As for the industry chapter, it expands the existing variables and adds new ones such as the tariffs and stock movements of petroleum products, the geographic distribution of hydrocarbon stations in Lebanon by investor, and the book industry.

Regarding the construction permits, this yearbook takes into consideration the Annual report for construction permits published by l'Ordre des Ingénieurs et des Architectes de Beyrouth in order to enlarge the existing data and to add new variables.

The Statistical yearbook 2008 exploits better the foreign trade data and definitions published by the Customs General Directorate in order to present data related to values, gross and net quantities.

We also decided to include a new chapter in this yearbook which is the habitat statistics which data are provided by the Bank of Habitat and by the Public Housing Institution.

As regards the tourism chapter, we decided to exploit the knowledge learnt throughout CAS cooperation with MEDSTAT II Tourism Program to study the tourism phenomenon through the supply and the demand sides.

Concerning the chapter on transport, we decided to study to the maximum extent the data provided by the Port Authorities in Lebanon, by the General Directorate of Civil Aviation, and by the General Directorate of Interior Security and by Liban Post.

On the subject of finance, we exploited more data published by the Central Bank of Lebanon, the Association of Banks in Lebanon, the Beirut Stock Exchange, and MIDCLEAR.

About education, we used to publish higher education data in Lebanon. But this year we add a new category which is higher education statistics published for the first time in Lebanon according to the International Standard Classification of Education (ISCED).

As for health, we exploit the Statistical Bulletins published by the Ministry of Health for the years 2006, 2007, and 2008 to display new data such as selected morbidity indicators, HIV/AIDS incidence and prevalence and vaccines.

On the topic of professional activities, we use the financial data published by the Ordre des Médecins au Liban.

As a result of all these efforts and as we have promised our stakeholders a better quality of statistics, the Statistical Yearbook 2008 is now here and it consists of five parts and 16 chapters. We would like also to mention that each chapter displays with summary tables and charts the available detailed figures in excel sheets.

Furthermore, we would like to thank all our ministerial, administrative and private counterparts who worked tightly with CAS in order to achieve the Statistical Yearbook 2008. We are also ready to cooperate with new administrative and private counterparts in order to improve the Statistical Yearbook 2008 data.

On CAS side, we appreciate the efforts of the specialist in economics Dr. Ghalia Hamamy in charge of the Statistical Yearbook and Monthly Bulletin (conception, data research and entry, analysis, translation, and page design), the specialist in geography Vicken Ashkarian for the thematic maps, the assistant statistician Saker Beainy, and the investigator Awad Zarzour for their devotion to field work within a teamwork dedicated to this task.

Finally, we hope that the Statistical Yearbook 2008 will meet all our stakeholders' expectations.

LEBANON AND THE FIGURES

The Statistical Yearbook 2008 consists of 5 parts and 16 chapters.

Part I – Residents in Lebanon. It consists of one chapter.

Chapter 1 – Residents in Lebanon: Data are related to residents' vital statistics and work permits in Lebanon.

Part II – Environment, Green Project and Agriculture. It consists of two chapters.

Chapter 2 – Morphology, climatology, hydrology, vegetation, and environment: Data are related to geomorphology, geology and soil, climatology, temperature, rainfall, wind power and direction, rainy days, hydrology in its geographic, statistical and institutional aspects, vegetation zones, forest fires and reforestation.

Chapter 3 – Green Project and agriculture: Data are related to the Green Project Activities, the foreign trade of agricultural products and the agricultural census conducted by the Ministry of Agriculture between 1997 and 2005.

Part III – Industry. It consists of one chapter.

Chapter 4 – Industry: Data are related to the production of some goods (cement, bottled water, soda, and juice), the industrial foreign trade, the imports, tariffs and warehouse of petroleum products, the energy sector (Electricité du Liban), the geographic distribution of hydrocarbon stations by investor, and the book industry.

Part IV – Business and Real Estate Registers, Entrepreneurship, Construction, Engineers and Trade. It consists of two chapters.

Chapter 5 – Business and real estate registers, entrepreneurship, construction and engineers: Data are related to the statistics of business register (new establishments distributed by geographic zone, legal status and economic activity), construction permits (Ordre des Ingénieurs et des Architectes de Beyrouth and the Order of Engineers and Architects of Tripoli – Lebanon), entrepreneurship statistics (Kafalat activity), real estate transactions in number and in value (sales, donations, and

successions, mortgages, levied mortgages, seizures, levied seizures, real estate number, transactions, and contracts, and real estate court).

Chapter 6 – Trade: Data deal with the Consumer Price Index made by CAS and with the foreign trade statistics published by the Customs General Directorate (Special and general foreign trade by section and chapter, by values, net and gross quantities, and continent, re-exports , transit, customs and value added tax revenues). This chapter displays the definitions of some foreign trade technical terms.

Part V – Services. It consists of 10 chapters.

Chapter 7 – Habitat: Data are provided by the Bank of Habitat and to the Public Housing Institution.

Chapter 8 – Tourism: Data mainly study the tourism phenomenon through supply such as occupancy (arrivals, nights spent and bed places in accommodations), demand (tourist sites visitors and hotel visitors and expenditures), and tourism generated employment.

Chapter 9 – Transport and post: Data deal with sea, air and road transport. As for sea transport, data are provided by all the Port Authorities in Lebanon. Regarding air transport statistics, the data provided electronically by the General Directorate of Civil Aviation is exploited to the maximum extent to generate very detailed air transport statistics of landings and take-offs, incoming and outgoing and transit passengers, loaded and unloaded cargo and mail by airline and by airline-airport. The data deal also with over flights and with air infrastructure and equipment. Road transport data display statistics regarding public and private collective transport, new vehicle recorded stocking, and road accidents by type (collision, pedestrian, against object, sliding, and car turn), Mohafazat, and consequences (accident, killed, injured, and material damage). Finally, mail and parcels data deal with Liban Post statistics regarding incoming and outgoing mail and parcels.

Chapter 10 – Financial sector: Data are provided by the Central Bank of Lebanon, the Association of Banks in Lebanon, Beirut Stock Exchange, Midclear and the Order of Money Exchangers in Lebanon. The Central Bank of Lebanon data deal with the balance sheet of the Central Bank of Lebanon and of commercial banks, the distribution of ATMs, the bank loans to economic sectors, the monetary situation, the banks clearings, the treasury Bills in circulation, the exchange rate, the private sector deposits in commercial banks, and the financing of foreign trade. As for the data

given by the Association of Banks in Lebanon, they display mainly the geographic distribution of bank agencies and employees salaries and allowances. The statistics provided by the Beirut Stock Exchange illustrate the monthly transactions and their value and the market capitalization at the end of period and at the end of the month. The Midclear data present the shareholders' number, the value of traded bonds, the cleared value, and the Management of Registrar's. Finally, data given by the Order of Money Exchangers in Lebanon exhibit the geographic distribution of these money exchangers by category (A and B).

Chapter 11 – Public finance: Data are provided by the Ministry of Finance regarding the fiscal performance and by economic classification.

Chapter 12 – Education: Data are provided by the Centre de Recherche et de Développement Pédagogique. They deal with academic, vocational and higher education. As for higher education, it is also studied according to the International Standard Classification of Education (ISCED).

Chapter 13 – Health: Data are provided by the Syndicat des Hôpitaux au Liban and by the Ministry of Public Health. Data given by the Syndicat des Hôpitaux au Liban deal with the private hospitals statistics. As for the data provided by the Ministry of Public Health, they display the hospitals related to the Ministry of Public Health by contracts and by geographic distribution, selected morbidity indicators, HIV/AIDS incidence and prevalence, and the Ministry of Public Health itemized budget.

Chapter 14 – Insurance and reinsurance: Data are provided by the Ministry of Trade and Economy for the year 2007. These data deal with the licensed insurance companies, the consolidated sector progress report (2001-2007), the consolidated sector balance sheet, the consolidated and condensed profit and loss, the consolidated sector income statement and, the taxation on insurance by branch.

Chapter 15 – Public insurance: Data are provided by the Civil Servants' Fund. They display old and new members and beneficiaries distributed by Ministry/Administration and by branches. They also show medical care and social contributions in volumes and in value.

Chapter 16 – Professional activities: Data deals with doctors, dentists, pharmacists and pharmacies, nurses, physiotherapists, photographers, and lawyers.

Finally, we adopted the "mode" to analyze the statistical variables.

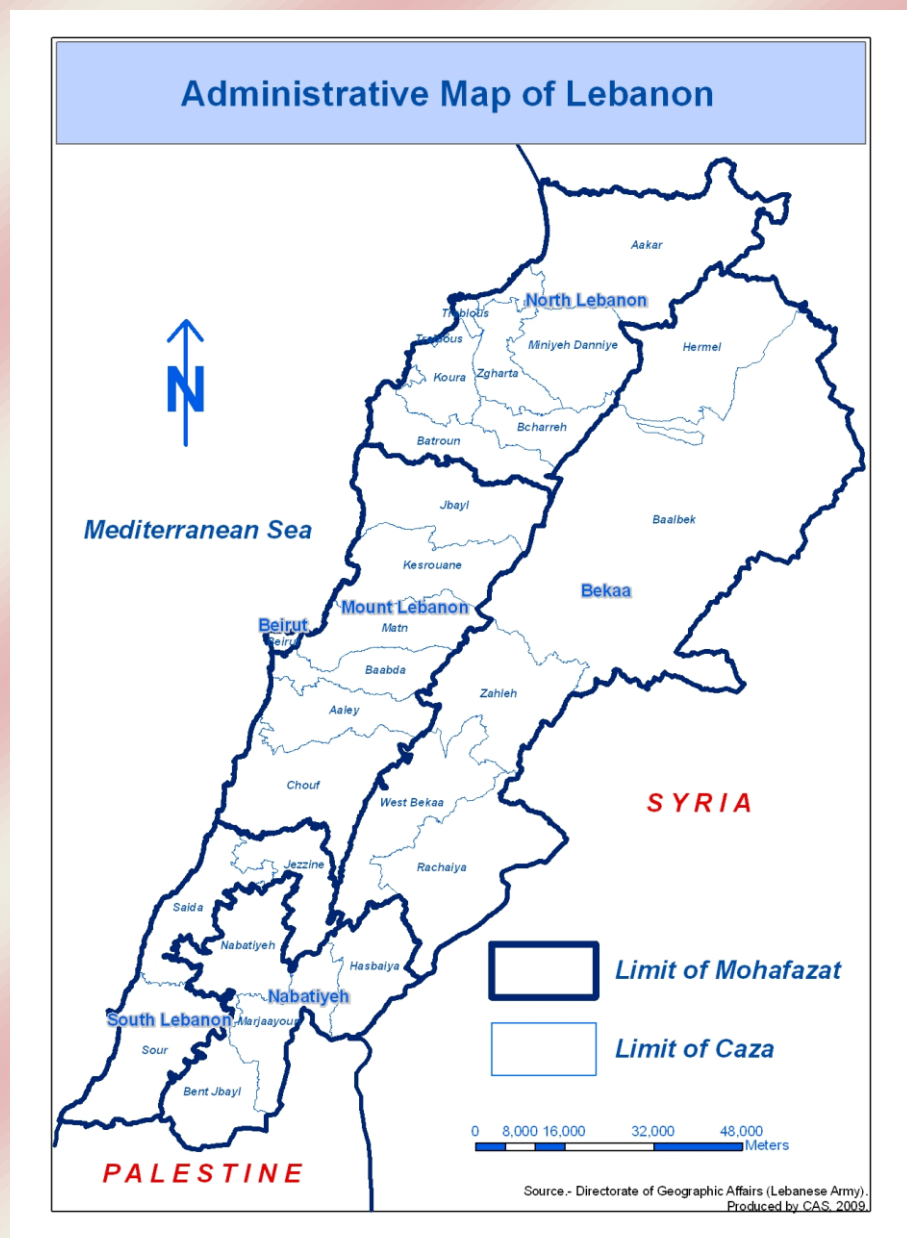

ADMINISTRATIVE DIVISION OF LEBANON

Located on the eastern coast of the Mediterranean, Lebanon is the second smallest country in the Middle East and in the Arab World. Its total surface area is around 10.452 km².

Due to its small size, population density and limited natural resources (water, soil and vegetation), Lebanon addressed the rest of the world to import resources and goods it lacks and to export its goods and services.

The special geographic position in the region, at the crossroads among several corridors crossing the East and the West, grants Lebanon several important roles, such as:

- Role of mediator and transit to and from Arab countries.
- Coastal role that helps creating numerous ports and developing trade activities.
- As the gate to the East, Lebanon played a regional role leading to adopt a policy of openness which transformed it into a commercial, banking and cultural hub.
- Being at the heart of the ancient world and enjoying a moderate weather and beautiful natural landscapes, Lebanon became a tourist and a summer destination.

Administrative division

Lebanon has two main levels:

- The *Mohafazat* (district) in the capital (or chief place) of which all public services are present under the authority of the *Mohafez*.
- The *caza* (sub-district), where it is possible to have several administrations under the authority of the *Caimacam*.

The administrative division being in a continuous transformation process, the Law 522/2003 sets the ground to create two new *Mohafazats*, namely:

- BAALBEK-HERMEL (capital: Baalbek) with two *cazas* (Baalbek and Hermel);
- AAKKAR (capital: Halba) with the *caza* of Aakkar.

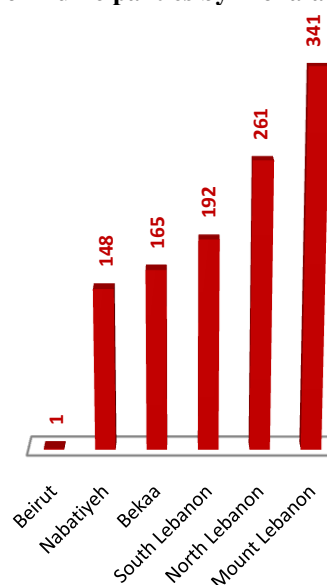
Nevertheless, various public administrations (including CAS) still adopt the six *Mohafazats* division.

On the administrative level, *Mohafazats* and *cazas* are followed by municipalities or local governments, which may sometimes correspond to Lebanese villages. Lebanon has around 1,550 villages and 1108 municipalities.

ABOUT CAS



Statistical law number 1793 issued on February 22, 1979 and law number 2728 issued on February 28, 1980 pertaining the organization of CAS govern the Statistical System of Lebanon.

In respect of law 1793/1979, CAS is an entity of the Presidency of the Council of Ministers in charge of:

- Preparing the country statistics.
- Supervising technically other government statistical units.
- Preparing national accounts and balance of payments statistics.
- Conducting surveys and studies which are requested by the Council of Development and Reconstruction and other government units.

Article 5 of law 1793/1979 stipulates: "All government units have to provide CAS with all data requested. Private sector as well, has an obligation to respond to surveys conducted by CAS".

Article 7 of law 1793/1979 stipulates: "CAS staff is not permitted to provide users, including government units, with any data related to personal matters of households of financial state of individuals or private entities".
