

CHAPTER 10 – EDUCATION

This chapter deals with school, technical and university education. It also displays the number of students and manpower of these establishments.

There are 2 788 schools having 911 314 students and 87 459 teachers. Moreover, there are 362 technical schools having 35 090 students, 447 administrators and 6 595 teachers. Finally, there are 38 universities having 146 961 students, 4 557 administrators and 13 770 professors (Centre of Research and Teaching Development, 2006).

1 School education

School education is divided among pre-school, elementary, intermediate and secondary. It may also be public, semi free and private.

1.1 Schools

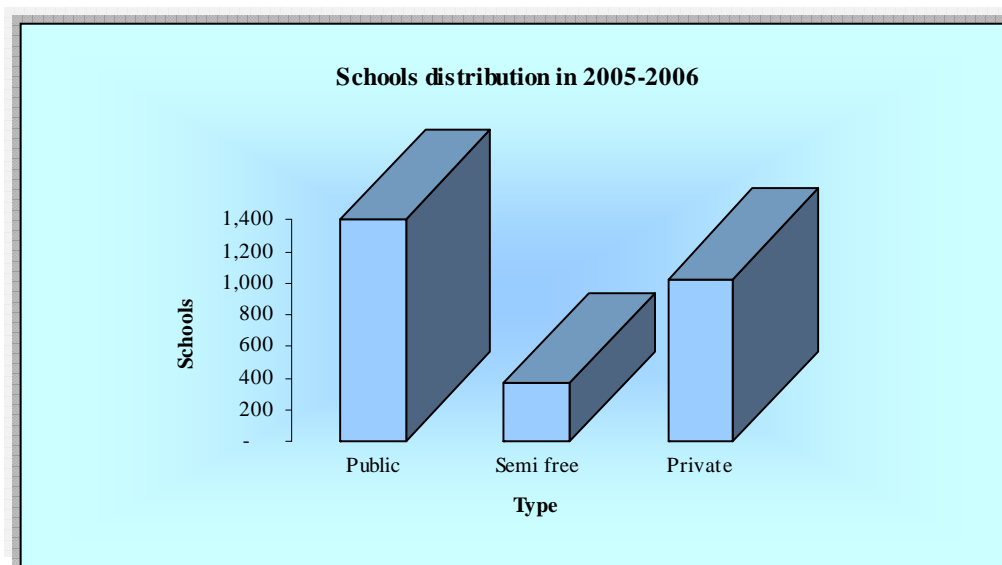

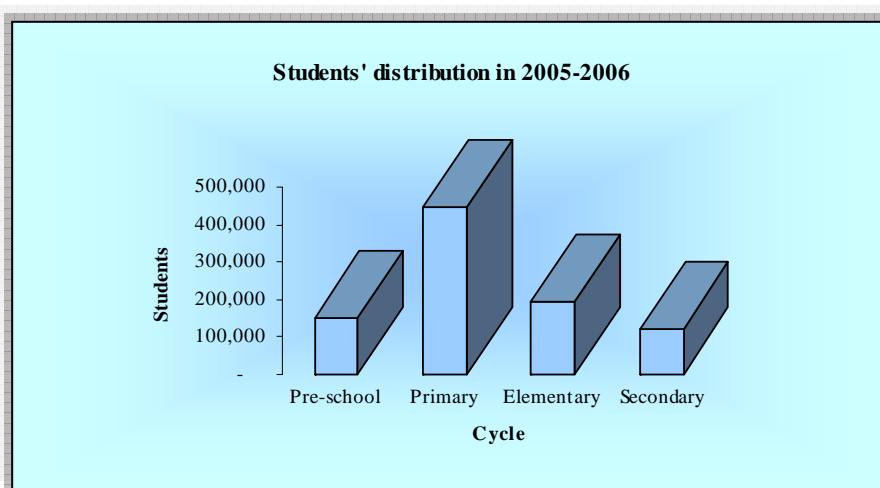

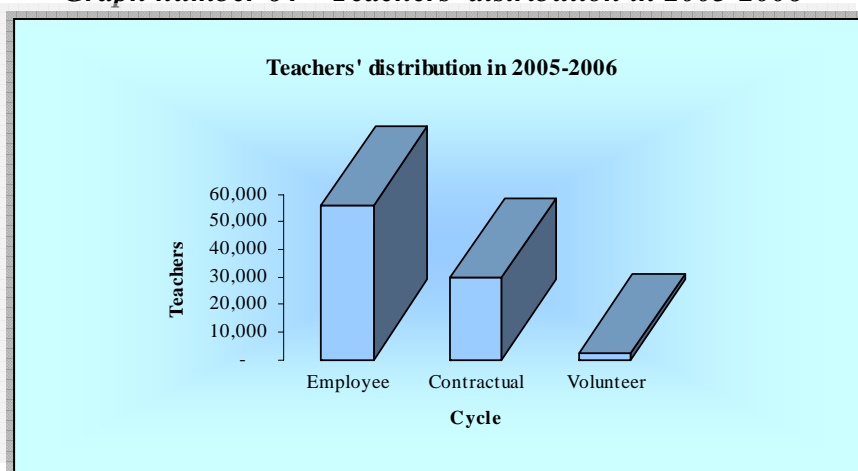

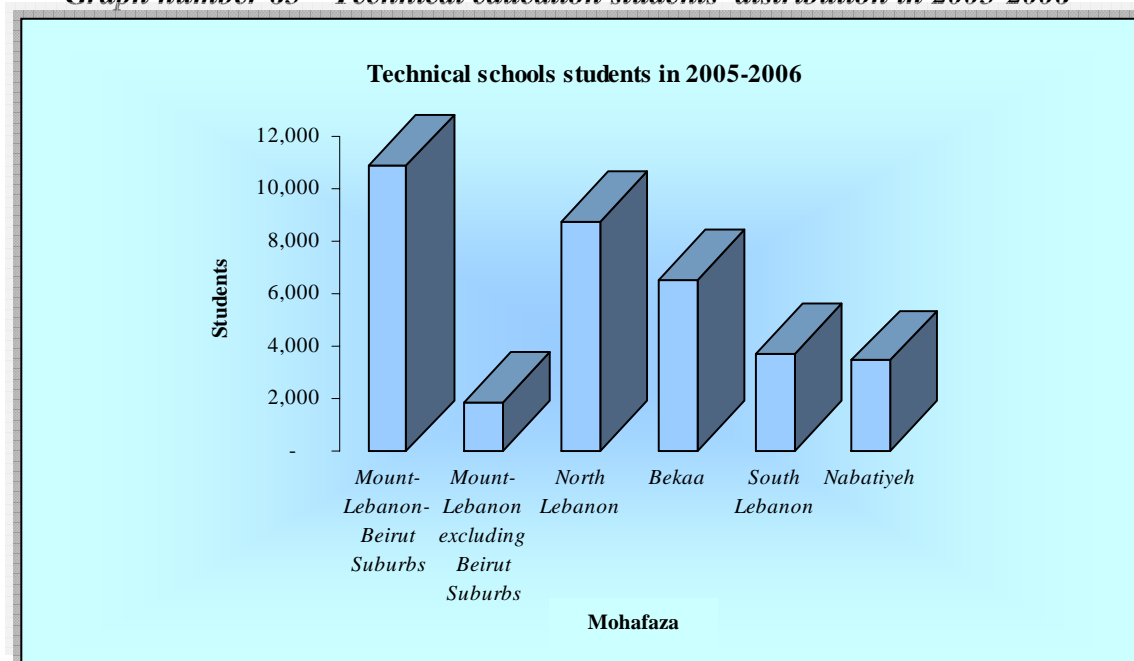
There are 15 090 studying in technical education institutes in order to have official diplomas.

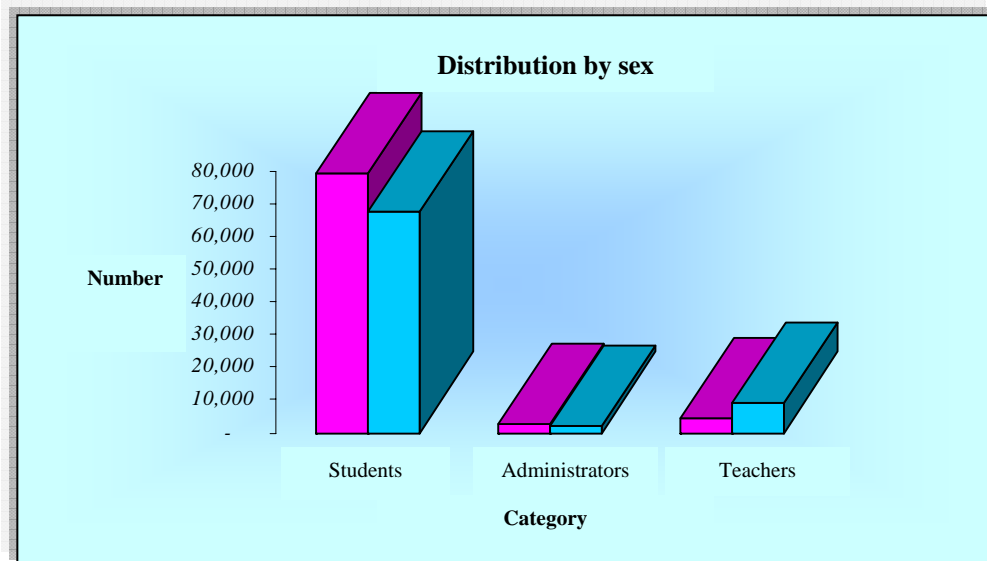
There are 38 universities in Lebanon having 146 961 students, 4 557 administrators and 13 770 professors (Centre of Research and Teaching Development, 2006).
