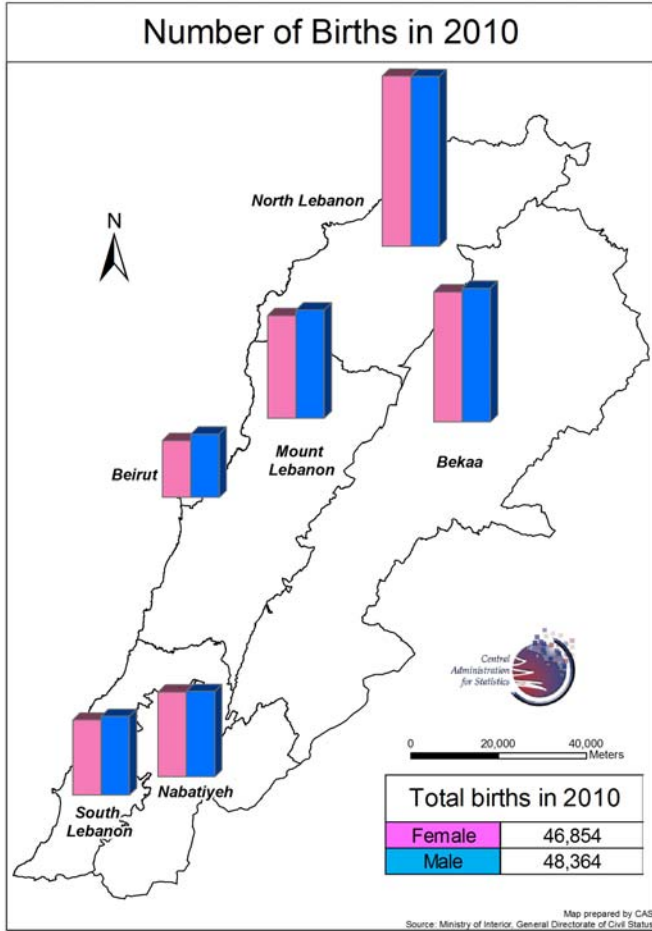
Residents in Lebanon include vital statistics, work permits given to foreigners, and prisoners in Lebanon

Vital statistics - Births

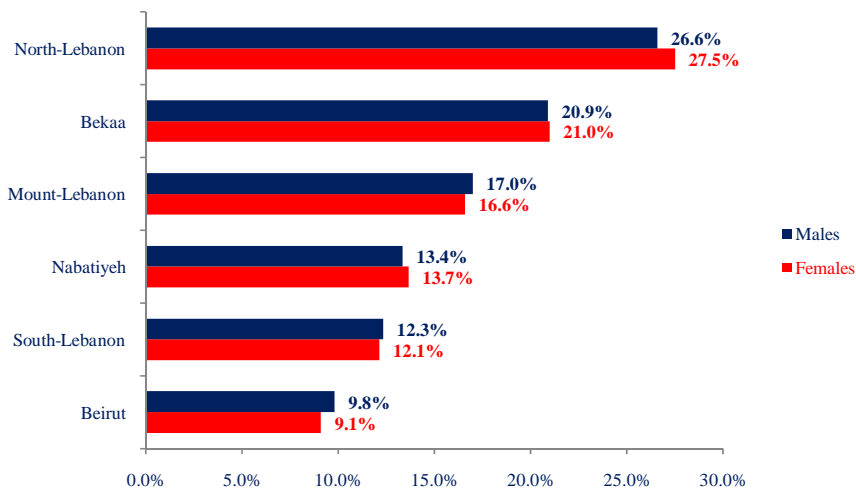
Over the 95,218 births in 2010:

- Females: 49.2% of all births.
- Peak month: July (9.5%).
- Peak Mohafazat: North Lebanon (27.0%).

3,759,137 residents lived in Lebanon in 2007 in 888,814 primary residences. 50.6% of the residents are females.



Graph 1.1 – Births by Mohafazat. Per cent in 2010

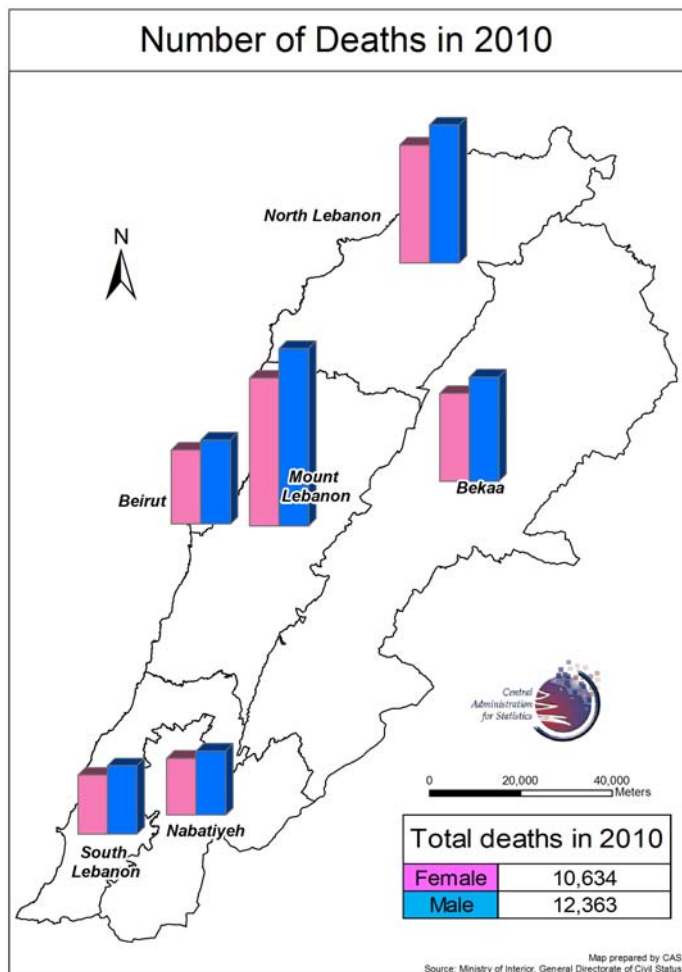

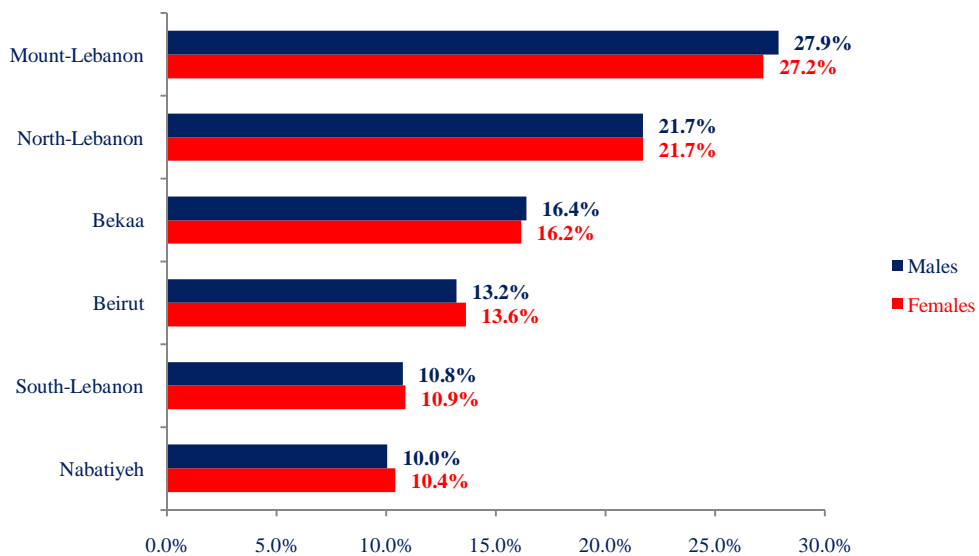
Vital statistics – Deaths

Over the 22,926 deaths in 2010:

- Females: 46.1%.
- Peak month: March (10.0%).
- Peak Mohafazat: Mount-Lebanon (24.2%).



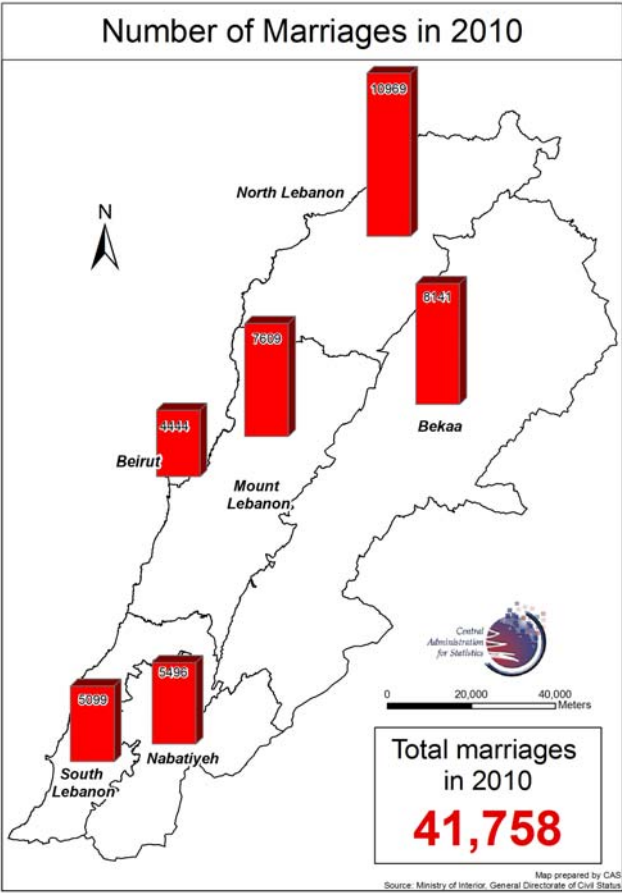
Graph 1.2 – Deaths by Mohafazat. Per cent in 2010



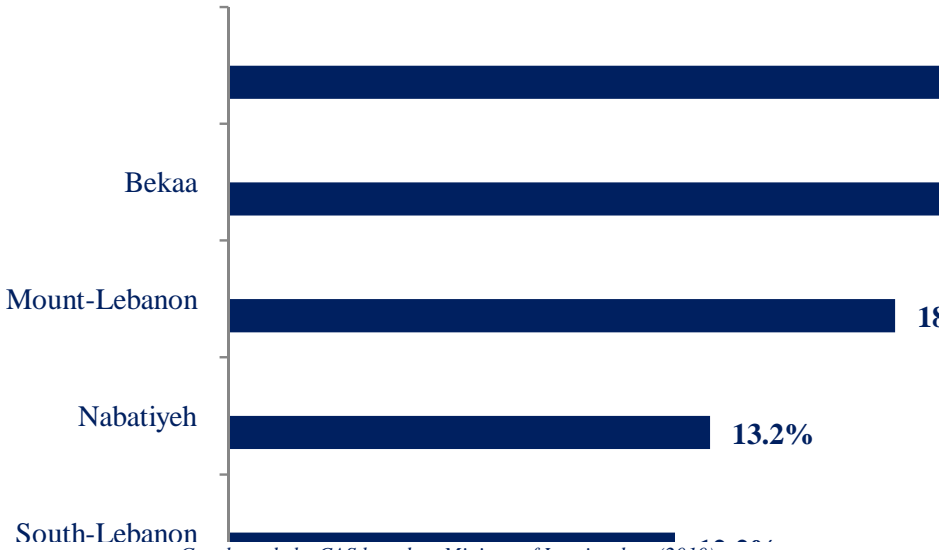

Vital statistics – Marriages

- Over the 41,758 marriages in 2010:
- Peak month: October (10.8%).
 - Peak Mohafazat: North-Lebanon (26.3%).



Graph 1.3 – Marriages by Mohafazat. Per cent in 2010

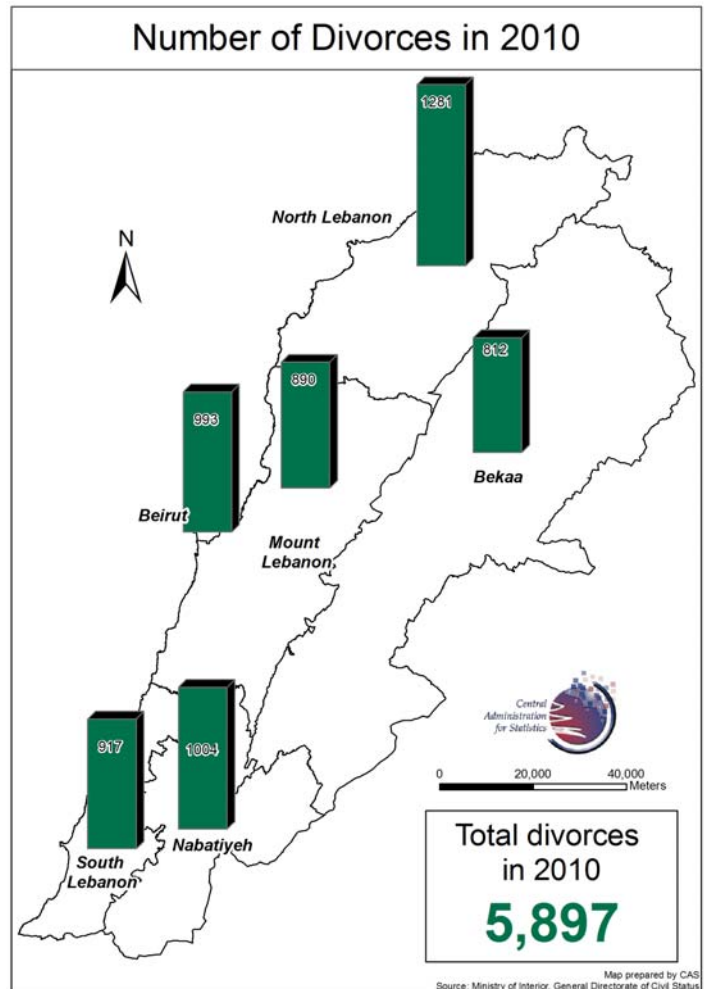

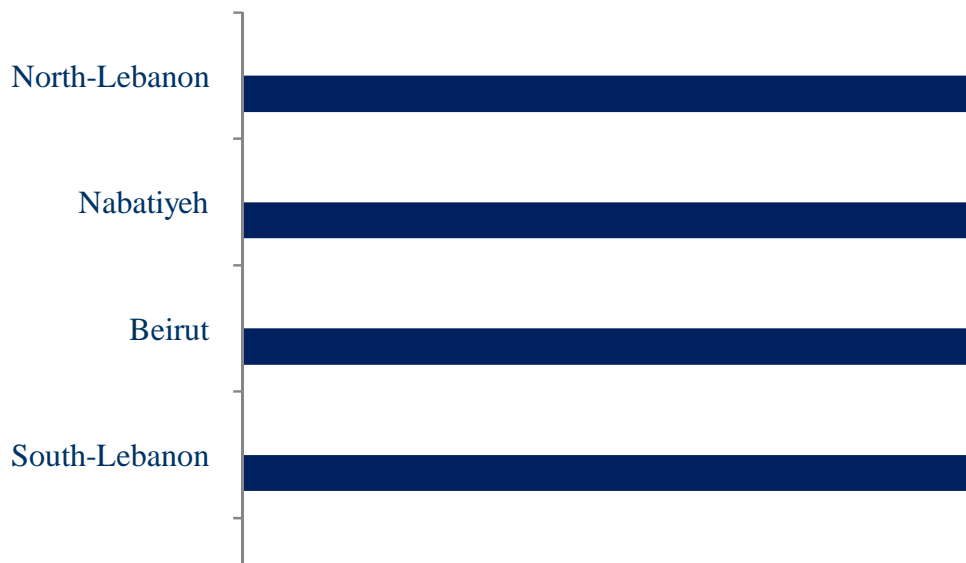
Vital statistics – Divorces

Over the 5,897 divorces in 2010:

- Peak month: March (10.1%).
- Peak Mohafazat: North-Lebanon (21.7%).



Graph 1.4 – Divorces by Mohafazat. Per cent in 2010



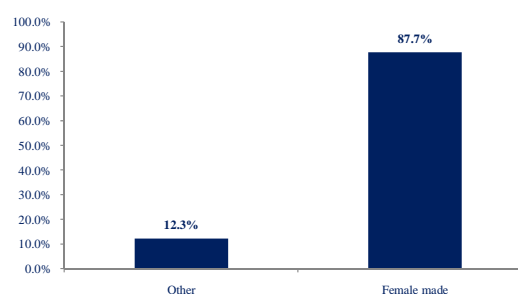

Work permits given for the first time in Lebanon

Over the 45,008 work permits delivered for the first time to foreigners in 2010 by the Ministry of Labor:

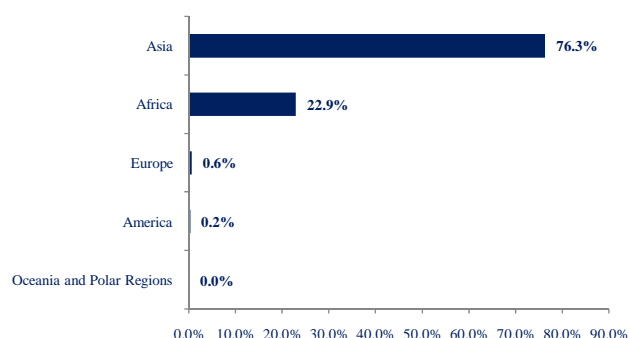
- Peak month: August (10.2%).
- Peak profession: female maid (87.7%).
- Peak geographic group distribution: Asia (76.3%).
- Peak country in Asia: Bangladesh (38.6%).
- Peak country on an international scale: Bangladesh (29.4%).

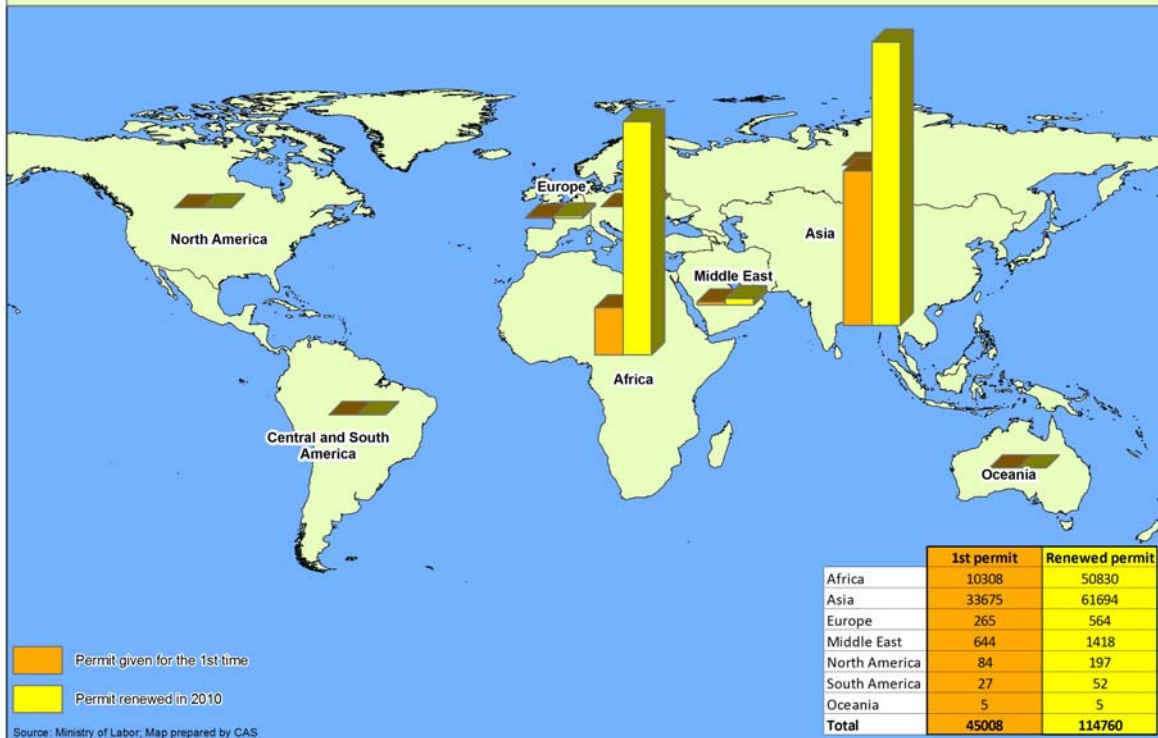
The 45,008 work permits delivered for the first time are divided on economic, energy, and arab zones.

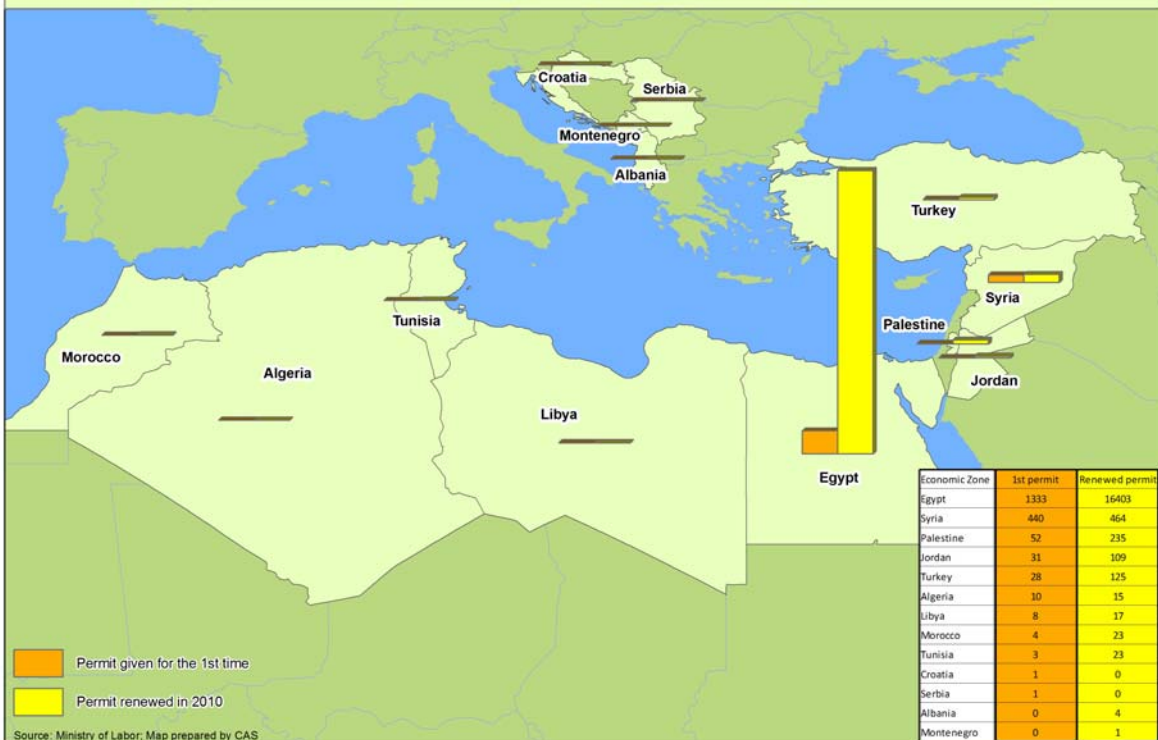

Work permits in 2010 (Mediterranean basin countries - excl. EU)

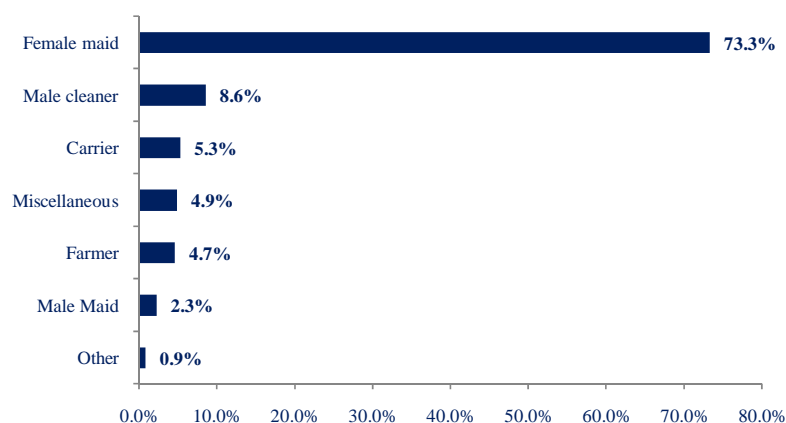


Renewed work permits in Lebanon

Over the 114,672 renewed work permits to foreigners by the Ministry of Labor in 2010:

- Peak month: May (9.2%).
- Peak profession: female maid (73.3%).
- Peak geographic group distribution: Asia (55.0%).
- Peak country in Asia: Philippines (30.6%).
- Peak country on an international scale: Ethiopia (22.8%).

Other (0.9%) includes mainly baker (0.4%), female cleaner (0.2%), employer (0.1%), and manager (0.1%).

The 114,762 renewed work permits are divided on economic, energy, and arab zones.

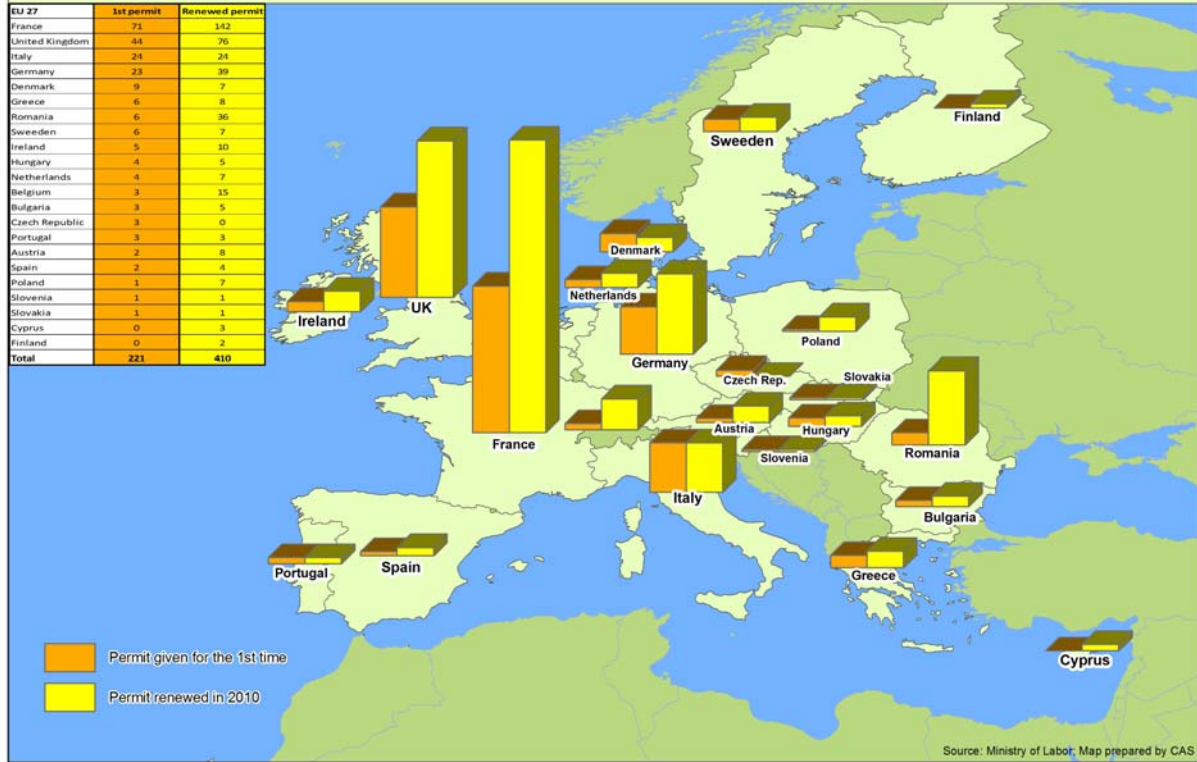

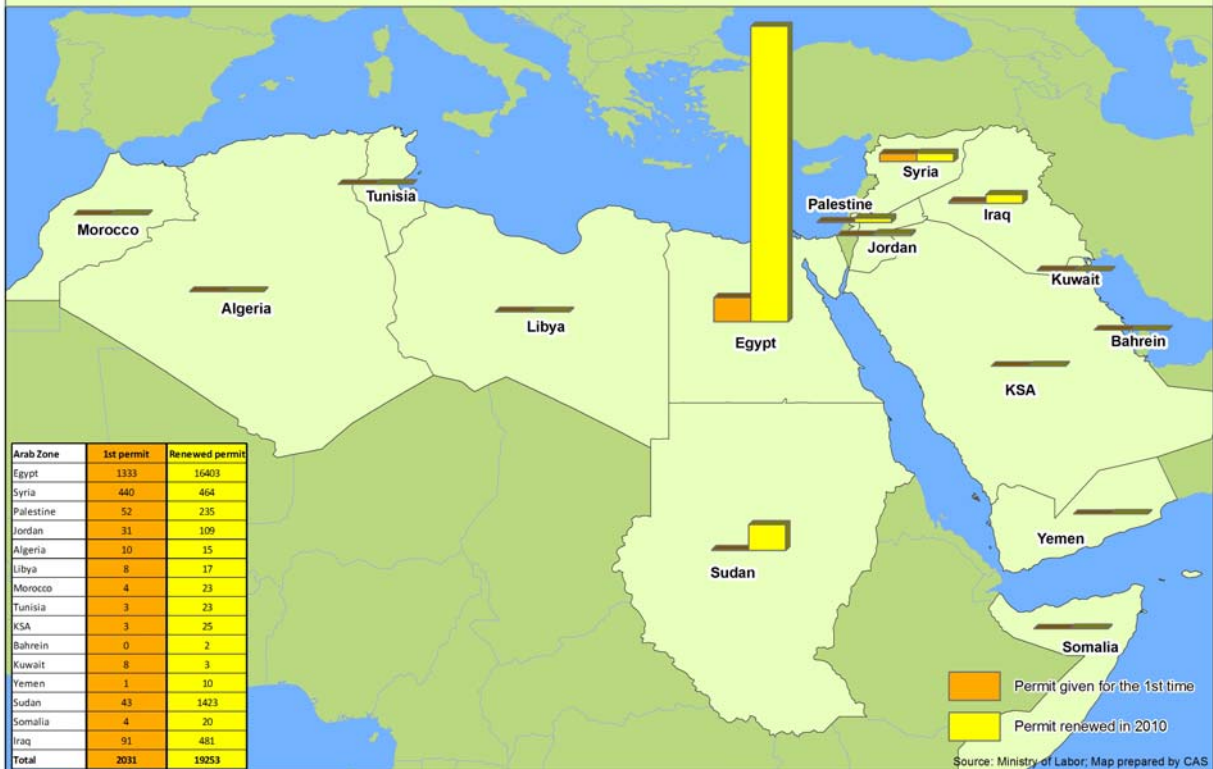

There are 20,176 prisoners in 2010.

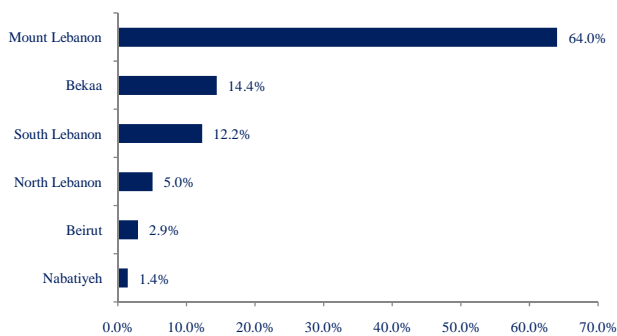

Car crimes in 2010:

- Stolen cars: 1,046 (monthly average: 87).
- Restored cars: 612 (monthly average: 51).
- Net cars: 434 (monthly average: 35).

All crimes in 2010:

- Theft: 1,884 (monthly average: 157).
- Drug abuse: 1,323 (monthly average: 110).
- Arrested people: 17,501 (monthly average: 1,458).
- Killed people: 95 (monthly average: 8).
