- Global Household Survey Programme carried out in more than 200 countries
- One of the largest sources of statistical information to assess the well-being and situation of children and women worldwide
- One of the most important surveys to highlight disparities in access to services and protection that threaten the lives of many

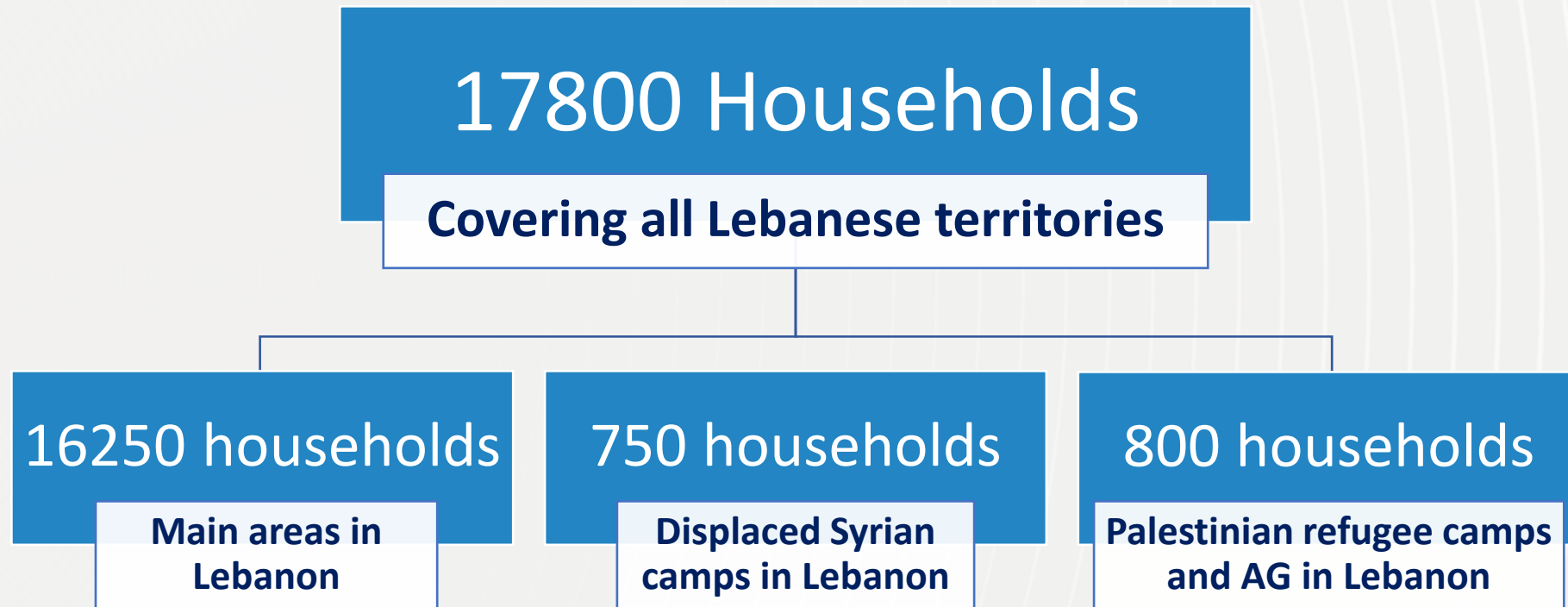

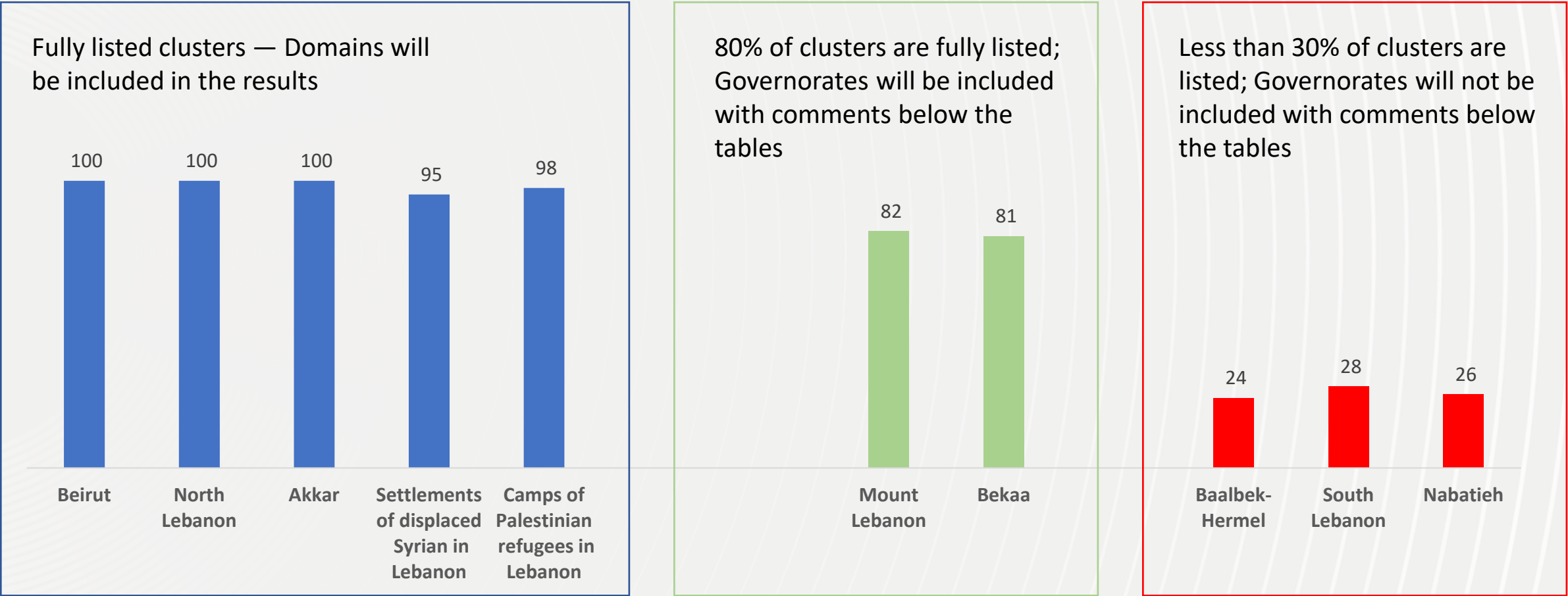
Objectives of the Multiple Indicator Cluster Survey MICS

- Provide high quality data about the situation of children and women in Lebanon
- Provide data and evidence to implement the appropriate development policies and plans
- Generate data on more than 160 internationally agreed-upon indicators
- Generate SDG indicators under 11 different goals

Theoretical Sample Size



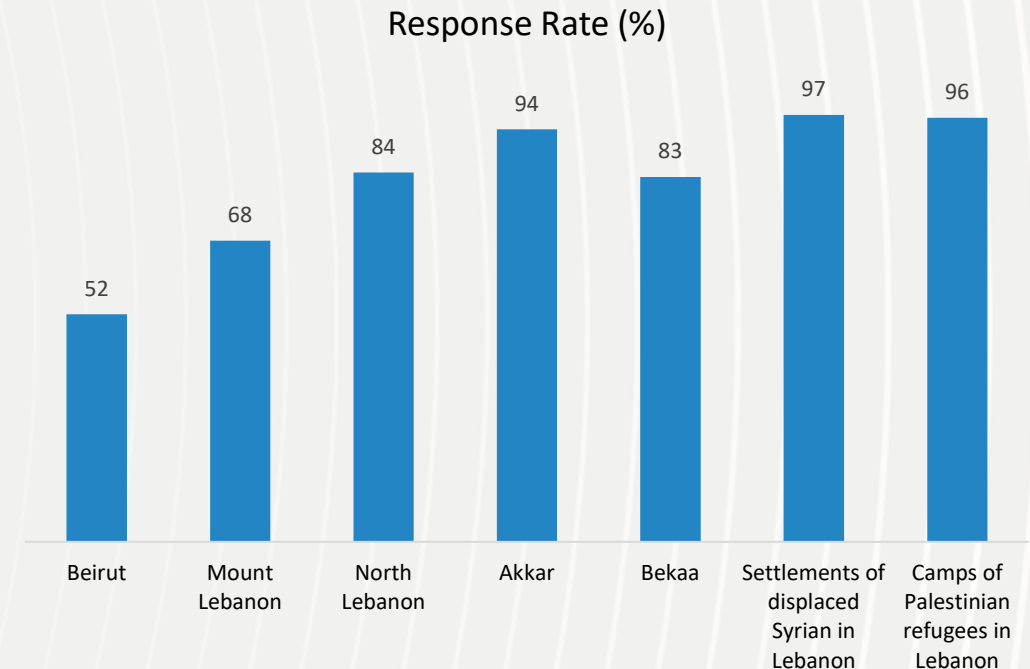
Percentage of Clusters Fully listed by Domain

 - Data was partly collected for Mount Lebanon and Bekaa (80%).
- Settlements of displaced Syrian in Lebanon (558 Households)
- Camps of Palestinian refugees in Lebanon (663 Households)

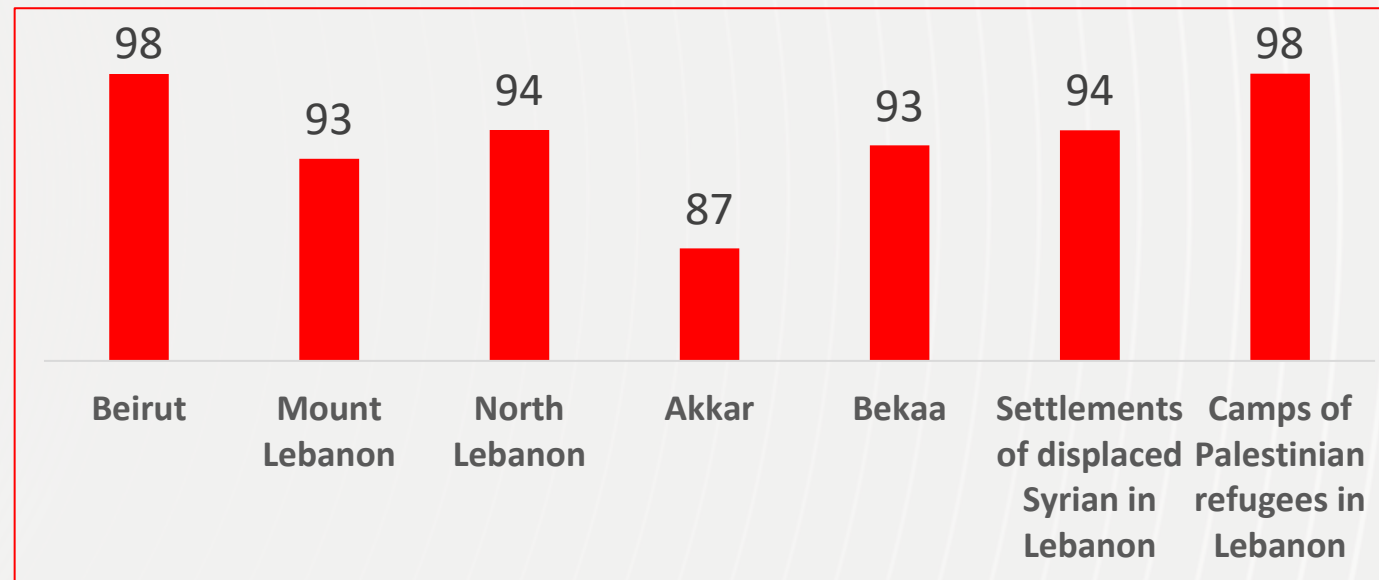

Use of basic drinking water services SDG Indicator 1.4.1

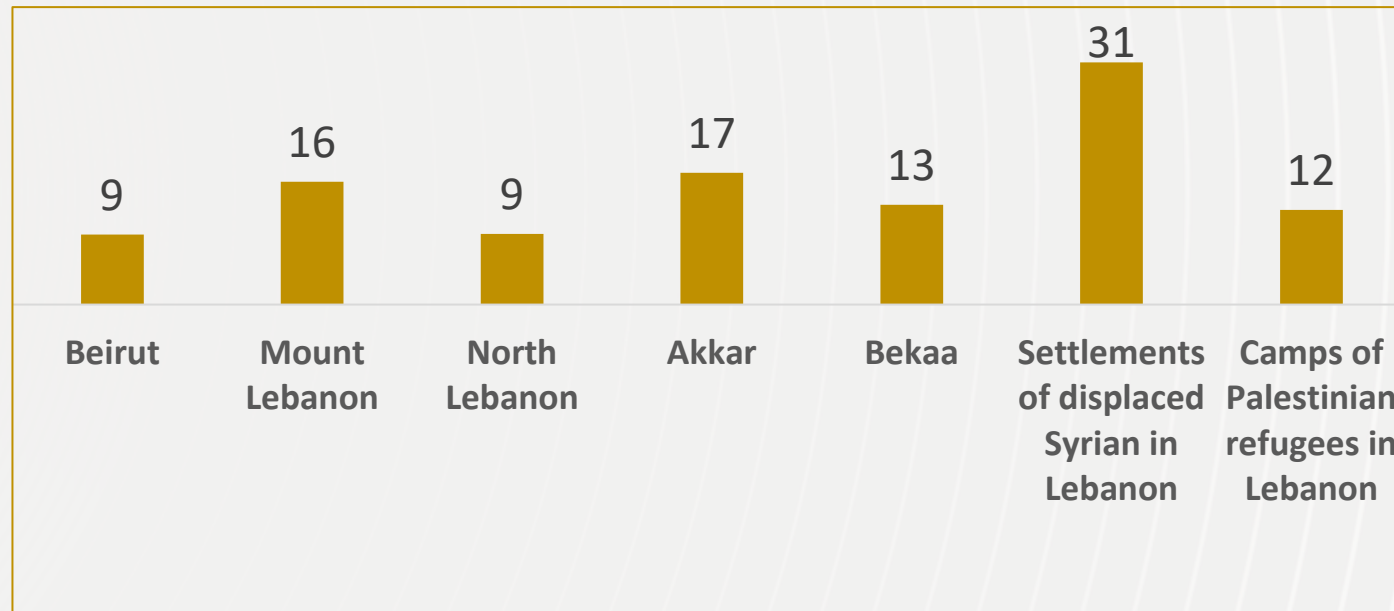


Percentage of household members using improved sources of drinking water either in their dwelling/yard/plot or within 30 minutes round trip collection time

Stunting prevalence (moderate and severe) SDG indicator 2.2.1

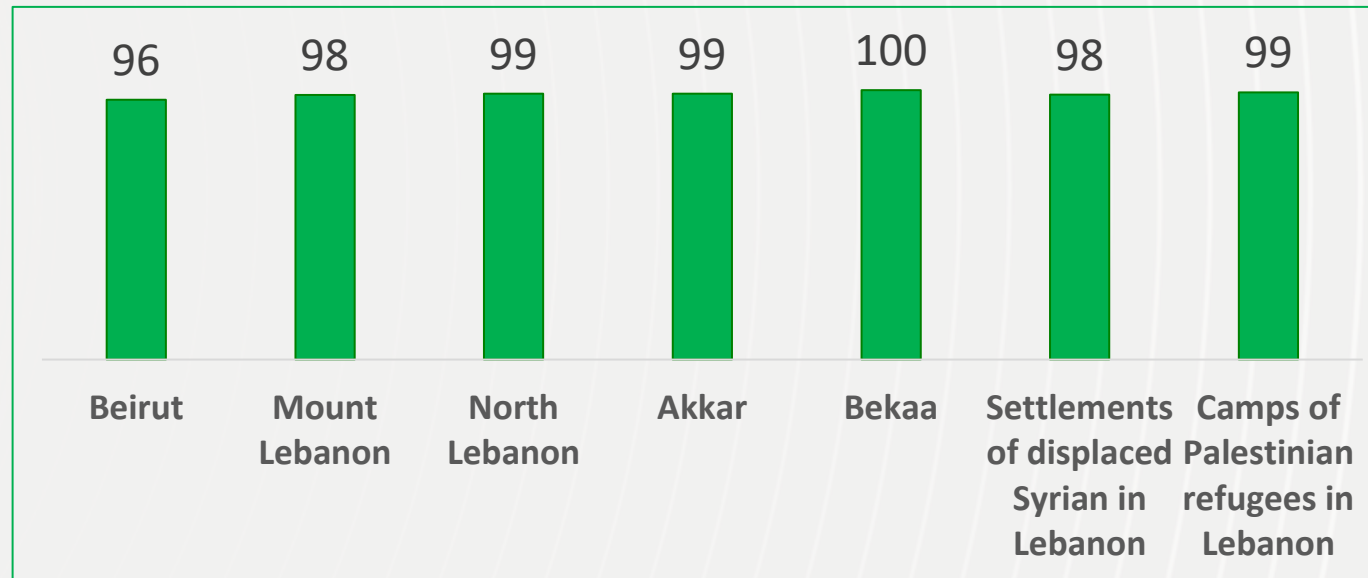


Percentage of children under age 5 who fall below minus two standard deviations (moderate and severe) of the median height for age of the WHO standard

Skilled attendant at delivery SDG indicator 3.1.2

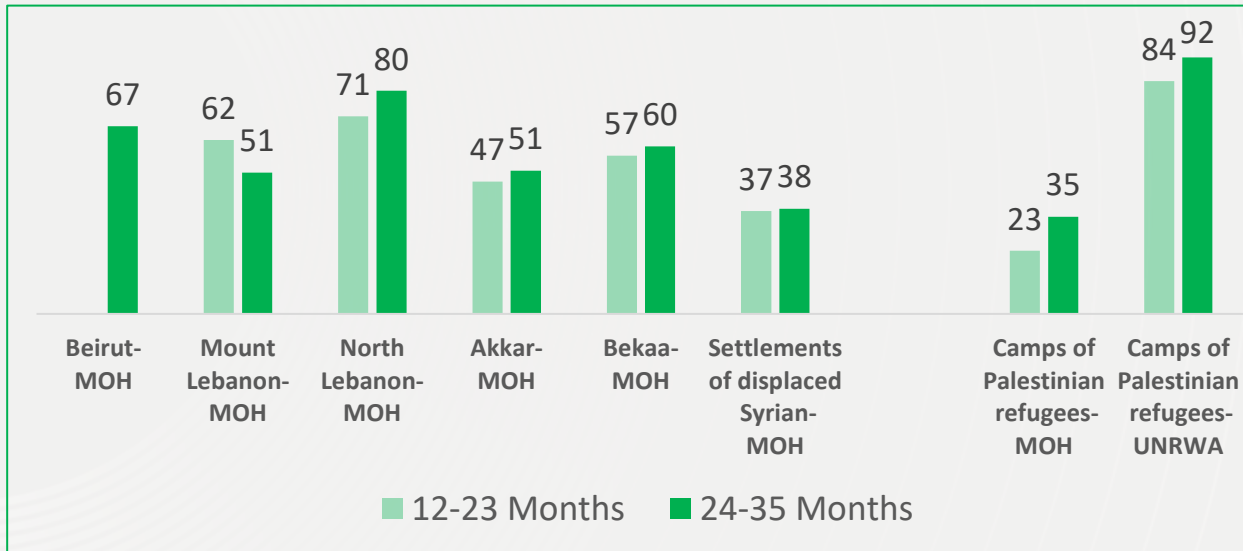


Percentage of currently married women age 15-49 years with a live birth in the last 2 years whose most recent live birth was attended by skilled health personnel



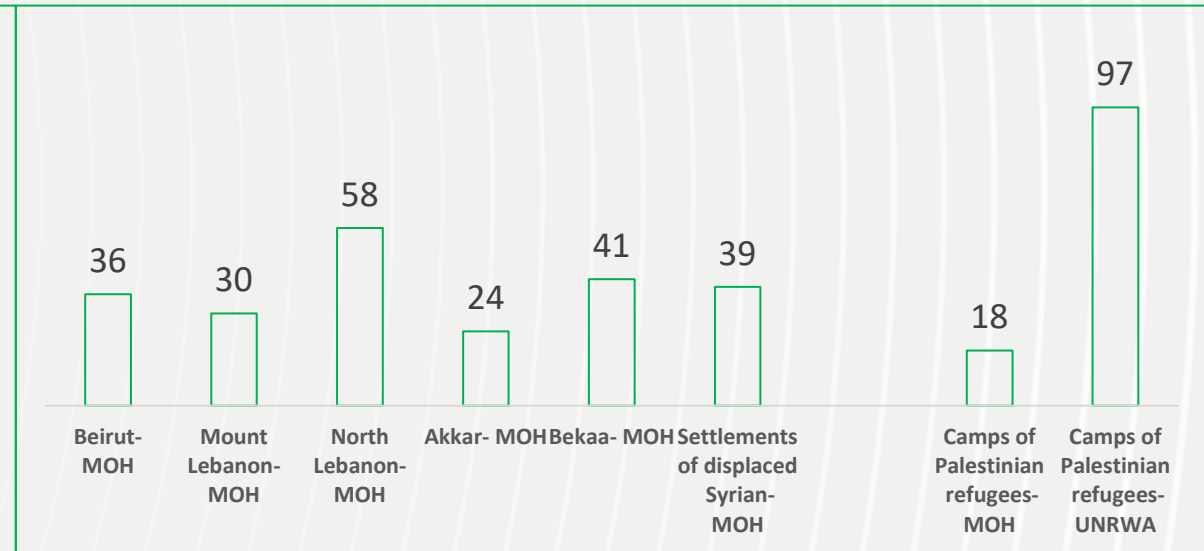

Measles immunization coverage SDG indicator 3.b.1

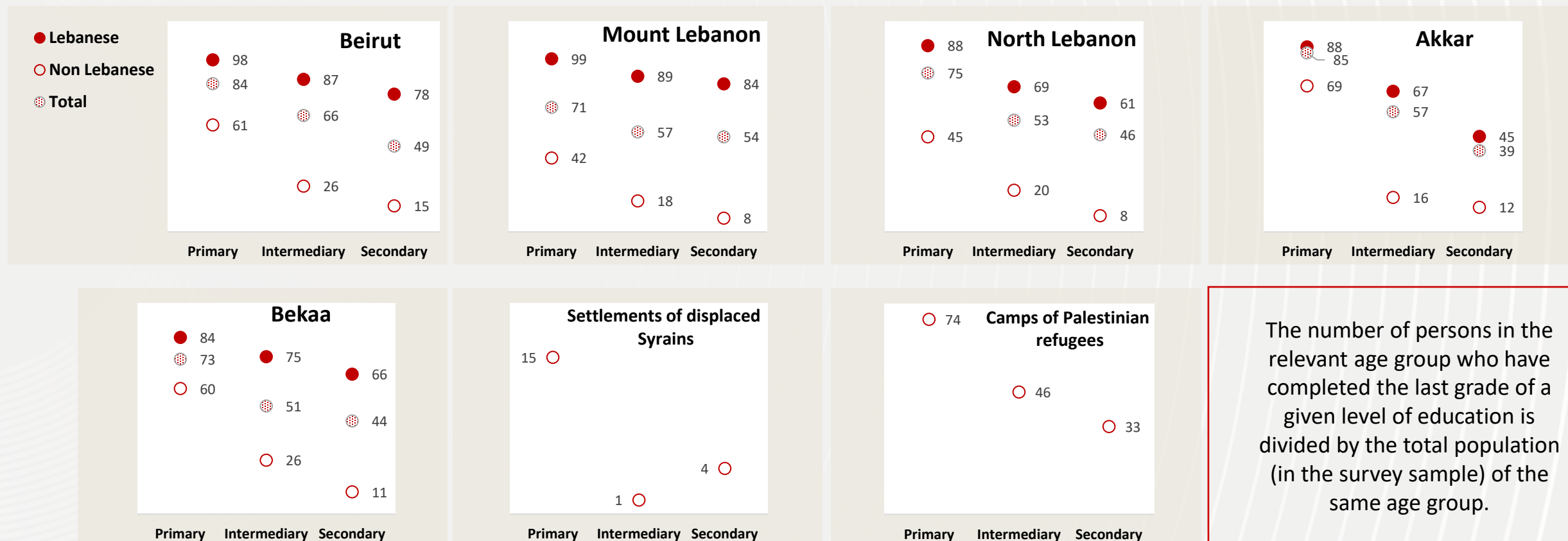


Percentage of children age 24-35 months who received the second measles containing vaccine at any time before the survey

Completion rate SDG indicator 4.1.2

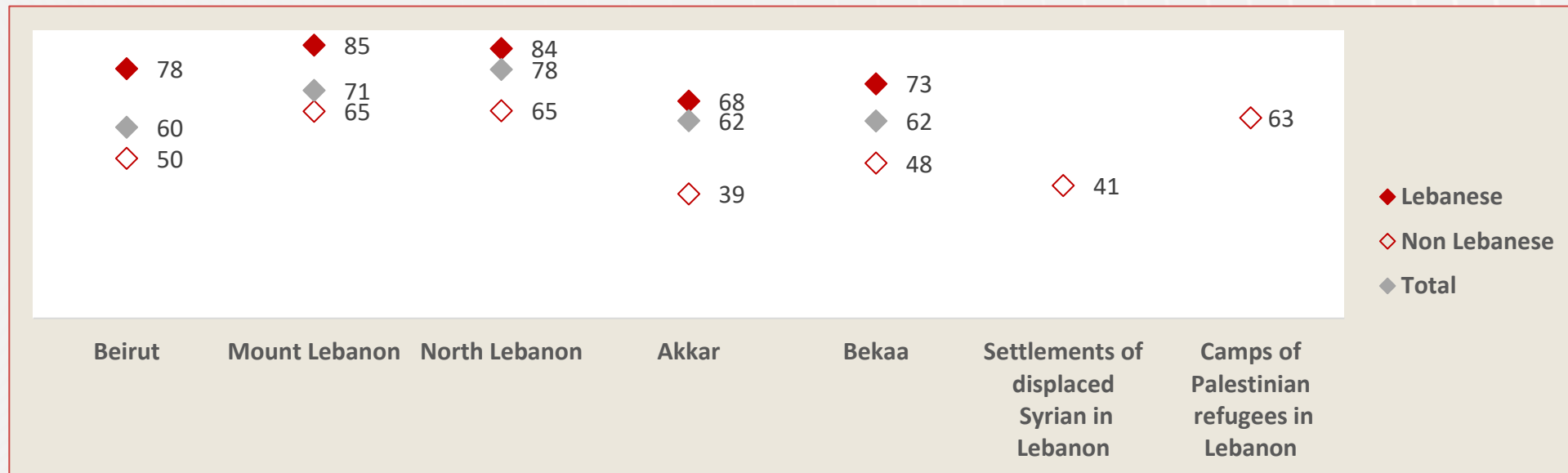


The number of persons in the relevant age group who have completed the last grade of a given level of education is divided by the total population (in the survey sample) of the same age group.

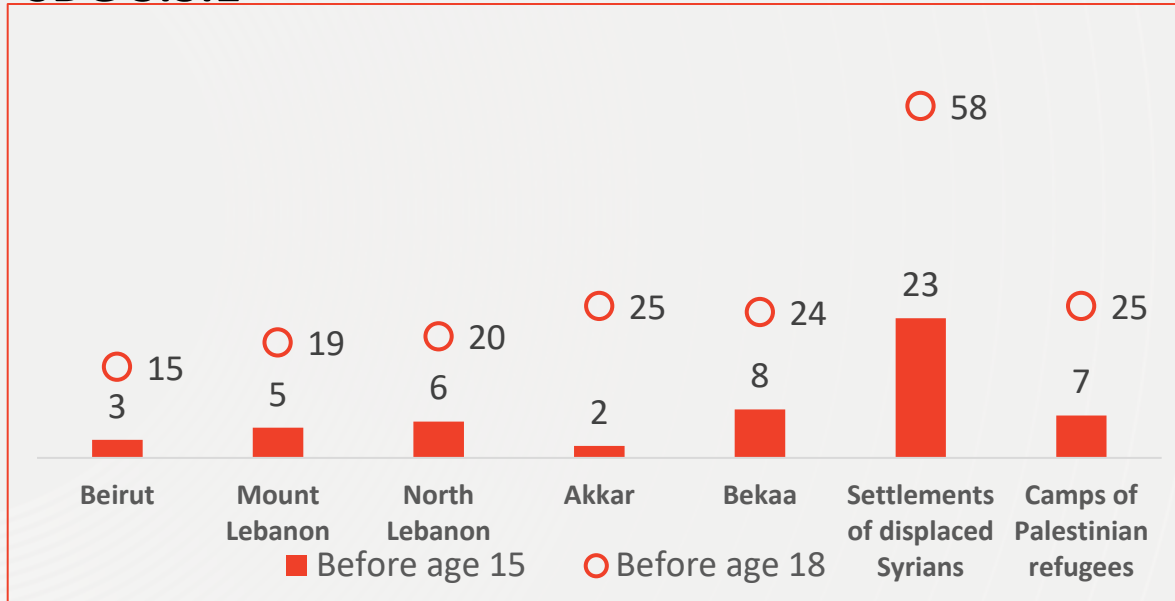
Early Child Development Index 2030 SDG Indicator 4.2.1



Percentage of children age 36-59 months who are developmentally on track in at least three of the following four domains: literacy-numeracy, physical, social-emotional, and learning

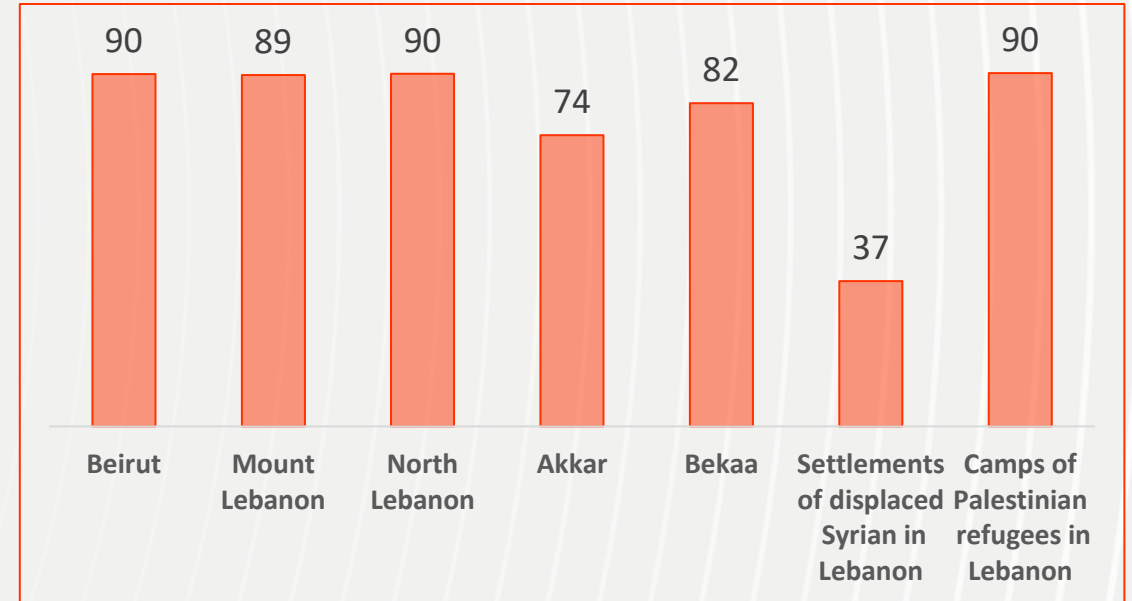

Ownership of mobile phone SDG indicator 5.b.1

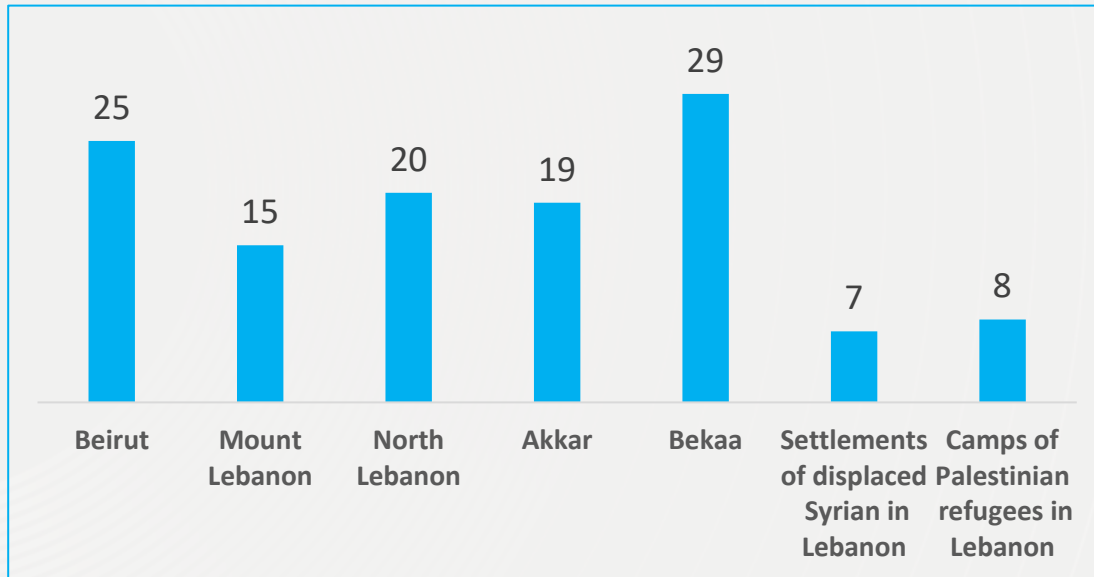


Percentage of women aged 15-49 years who own a mobile phone



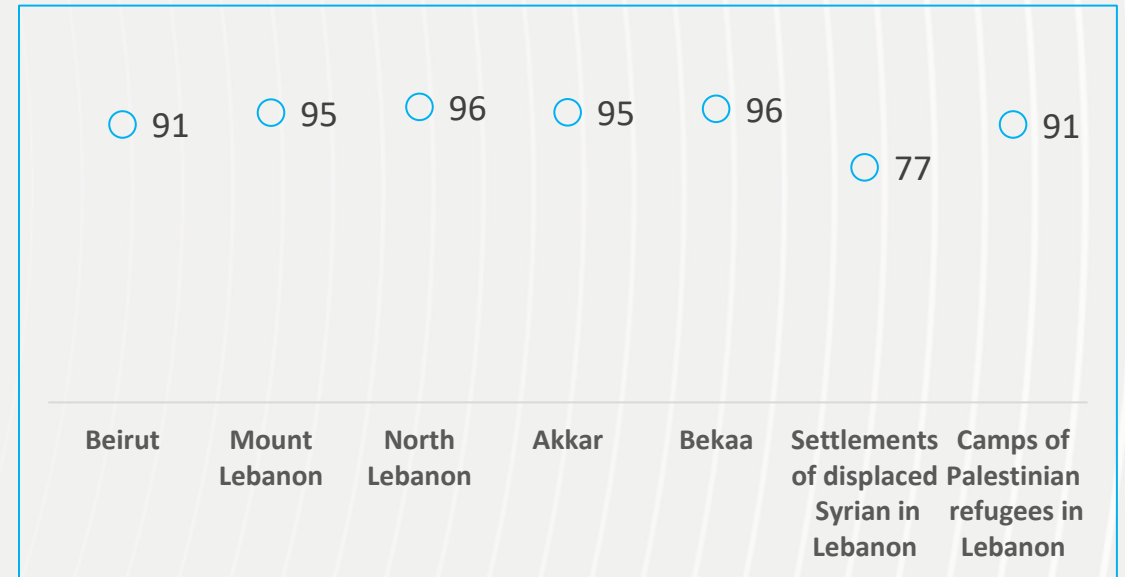

Handwashing facility with water and soap SDG indicators 6.2.1

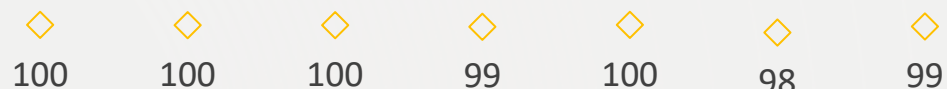


Percentage of household members with a handwashing facility where water and soap or detergent are present



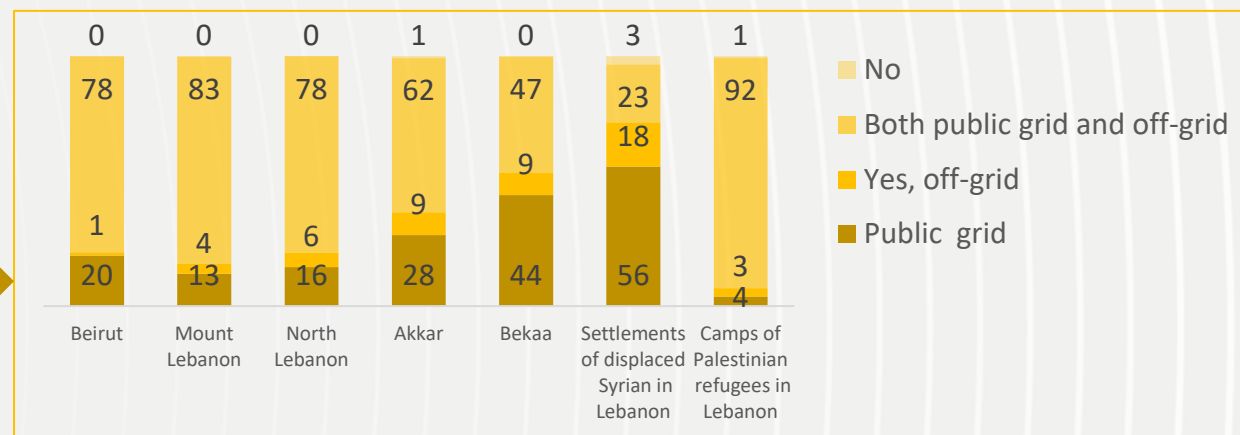

Access to electricity SDG Indicator 7.1.1

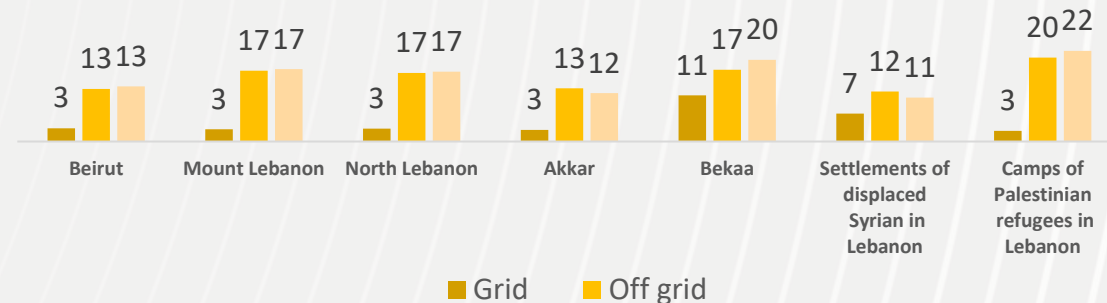

Percentage of household members with access to electricity from all sources in the household



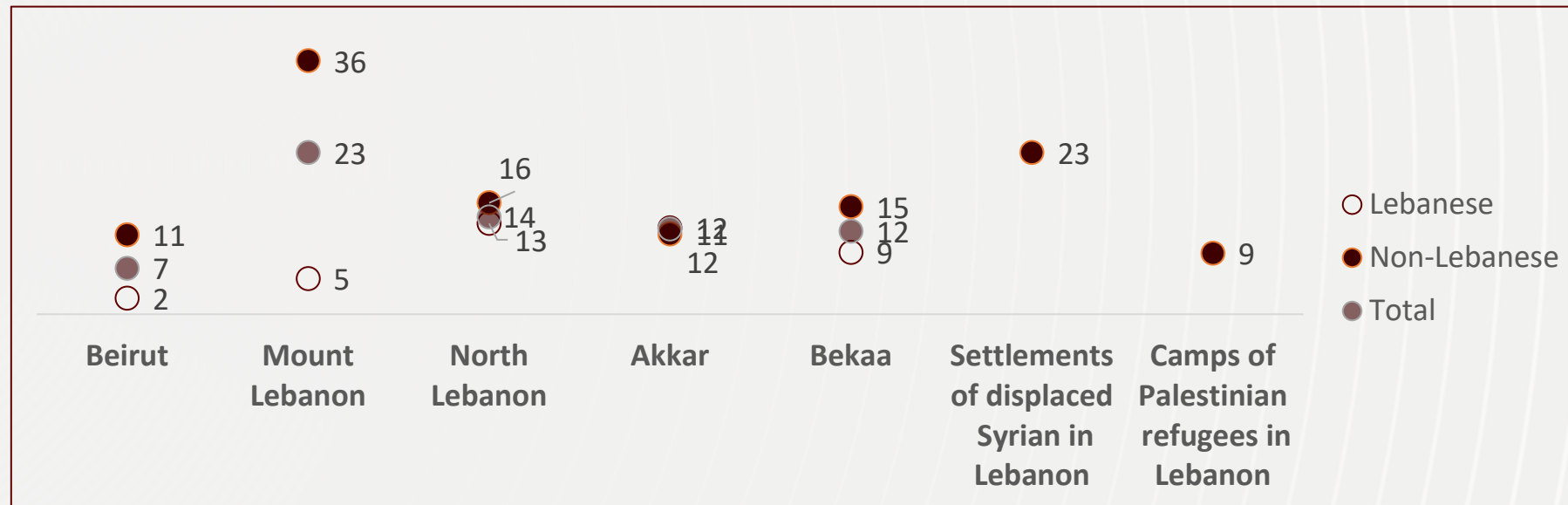
Average daily number of hours of electricity

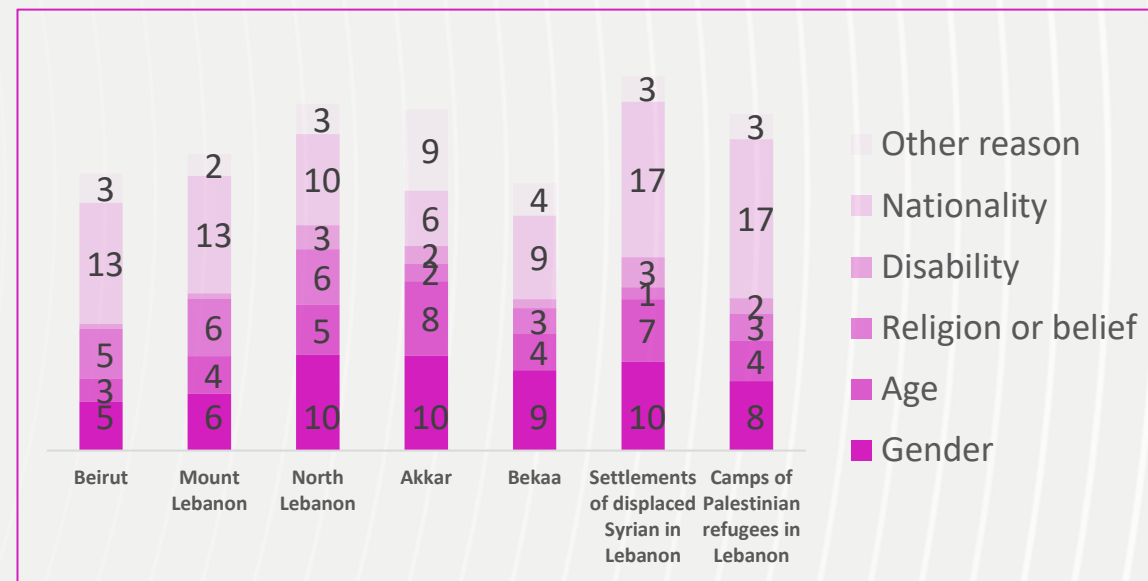
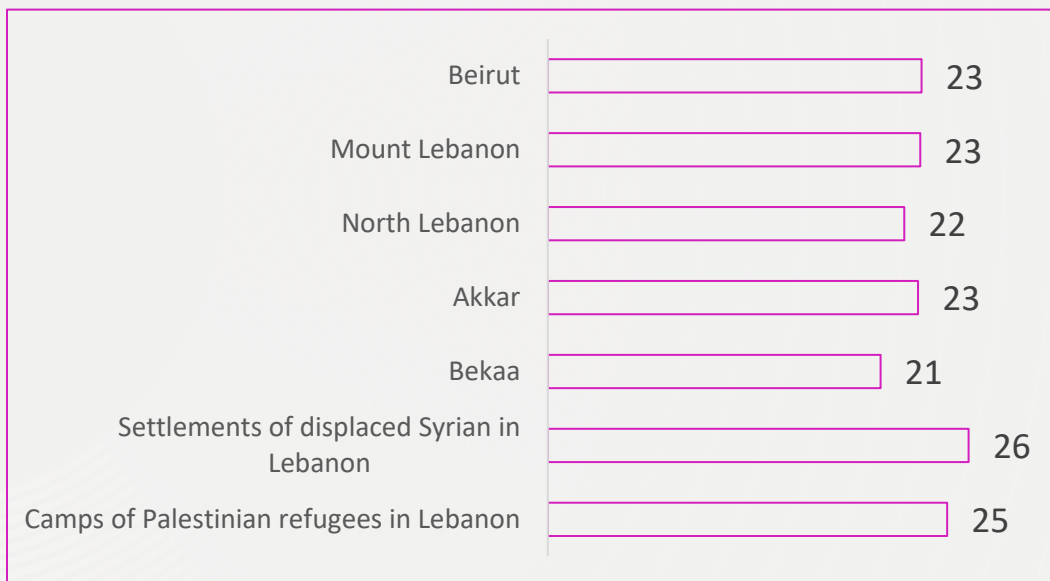
Child labour SDG indicator 8.7.1



Percentage of children age 5-17 years who are involved in child labour

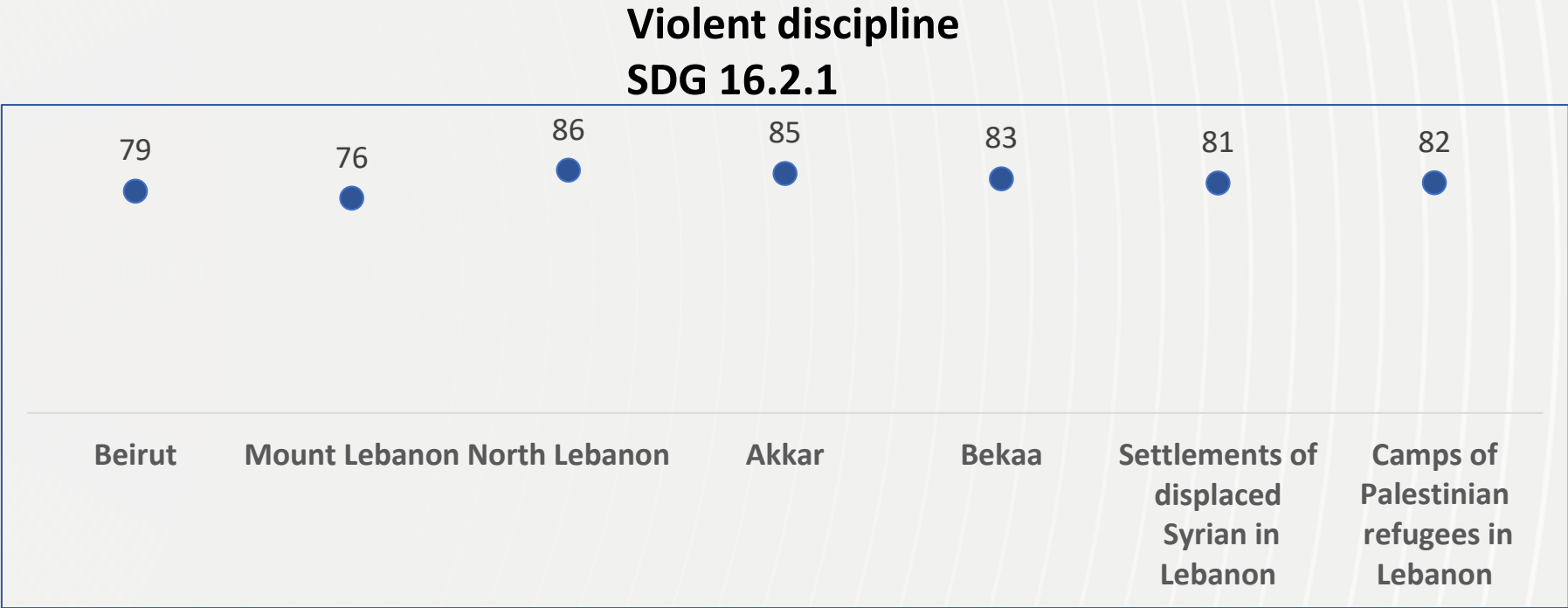

Percentage of women aged 15-49 years who in the past 12 months have felt discriminated against or harassed

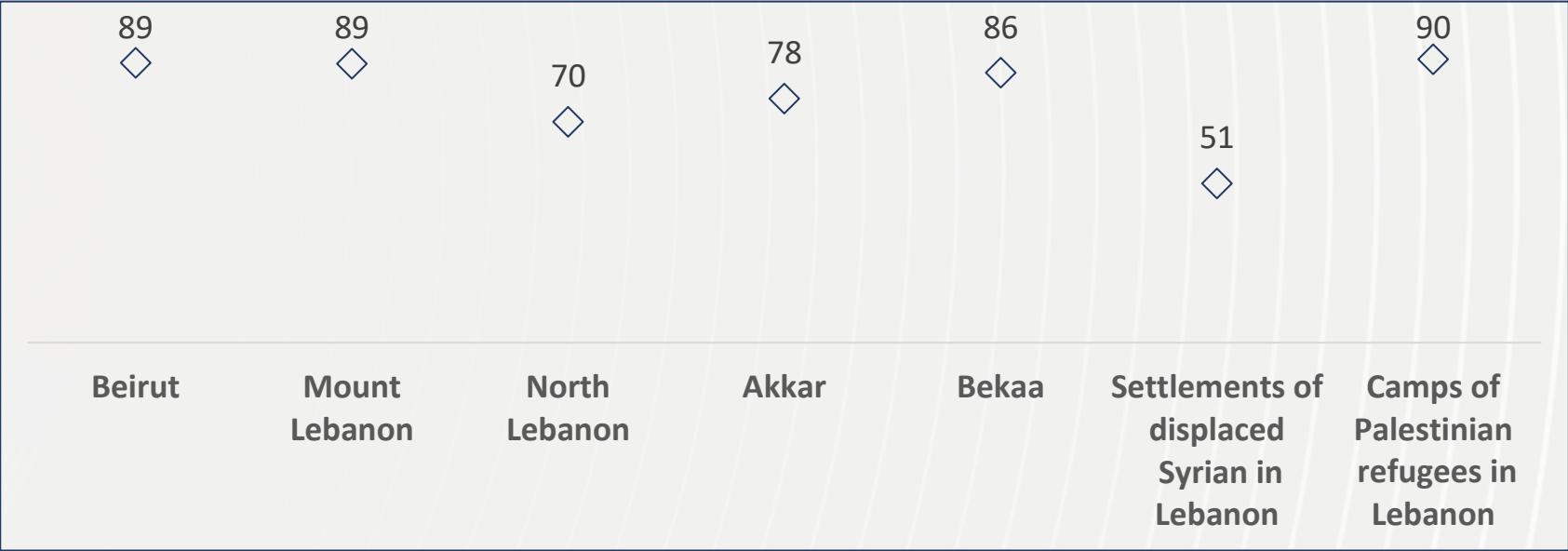
Significantly reduce all forms of violence and related death rates everywhere

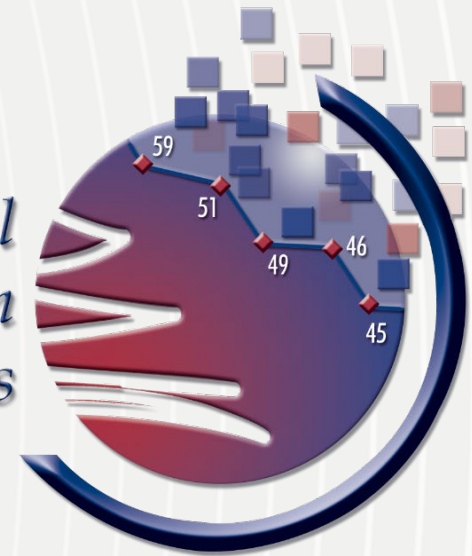
Percentage of women aged 15-49 years who have ever used internet during the last 3 months
